What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Barber Middle School

will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. How is it revised?

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this Policy. Barber Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities and of migratory children. In cases where the students reside in a Neglected and Delinquent residential facility, a representative from that facility can serve as a proxy for the parent(s).

Where is it available?

The Plan is distributed to all parents during Conference Week in October. The Plan is also posted on the school website. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the Plan from the Parent Resource Room.

We will:
