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# Graduation Test Scores Uneven, But Still Outperform Cobb 11th Graders Surpass Peers In State, Metropolitan Area 

Cobb County 11th graders continued to outperform their peers on each content area of the statewide Georgia High School Graduation Test (GHSGT). Scores dipped in Math and Social Studies, improved in Science, and remained unchanged in English-Language Arts.

Cobb's mean scale score of 246 in English-Language Arts is eight points higher than the state average of 238, and five points higher than the metro Atlanta system average of 241 . Scale scores dropped slightly in Math (from 542 to 540 ), but remain six points above the state (534) and four points higher than scores for metro Atlanta systems (536). Science and Social Studies scores also topped both state scores and those of the metro peer group (See Table I).

The percentage of Cobb students passing the Science portion of the test increased to 92 percent, up two percentage points from 2009. Traditionally, the Science test has proven a greater challenge for Cobb students. Schools have increased focus on science instruction to address the new Georgia Performance Standards (GPS) and this year's increase demonstrates the success of increased rigor in that subject area. Seven Cobb high schools - Allatoona, Harrison, Hillgrove, Kennesaw Mountain, Lassiter, Pope and Walton - each had more than 95 percent of juniors pass the science portion. The overall percentage of students meeting standards has consistently improved over a five-year period for all student subgroups, with notable long term gains by Black students ( 33 percent) and Hispanic students (31 percent). Scores for students qualifying as English Language Learners (ELL) increased 32 percent over the same five-year period.

Due to the transition in Georgia's Social Studies curriculum from Quality Core Curriculum (QCC) standards to GPS, the percentage of students passing the Social Studies portion of the GHSGT decreased across the state. The percentage of Cobb students meeting or exceeding standards in Social Studies dipped from 91 percent to 84 percent, primarily because of new, tougher testing requirements. Over the past few years, the state has phased in graduation testing for all content areas based on the GPS. Each time the switch is made, scores dip the first year and then begin to rebound as schools and teachers adjust their instruction. That same trend is expected to continue with Social Studies.

[^0]Students are required to pass all four content area tests and the writing test in order to graduate. Across the district, 81 percent of students passed all four content area tests this spring, which compares favorably with rates for other metro districts ( 77 percent) and the state ( 74 percent). Students who do not pass one of the tests will have the opportunity to retake the tests several times prior to graduation in their senior year.

Tests based solely on the GPS were administered in English Language Arts, Science and Social Studies to students in the spring 2010 administration. The Math portion of the test is based on the older QCC standards, but will change to GPS standards for next year's administration.

The percentage of students reaching higher levels of performance on GHSGT is a strong indicator of the rigor included in Cobb's curricular and instructional programs. To reach these higher levels of achievement, students must attain target scores that are set higher than the minimum scale score needed to pass each section and earn a diploma. These scores vary in each test subject area. In English-Language Arts, 67 percent of Cobb students reached the Advanced Proficiency or Honors level. In Math, which is still under the QCC standard, 61 percent of students attained 'Pass Plus' status; in Science, 60 percent attained Advanced Level or Honors level; and in Social Studies, 47 percent attained Advanced Level or Honors level (see Table II).
"With more than half of our juniors reaching advanced levels of proficiency in English-Language Arts, Math and Science, it is clear that our students are going to be competitive in their educational and career paths after they graduate next year," said Superintendent Fred Sanderson. "We continue to move toward our goal of providing every student with a world class education."

Several individual high schools showed exceptional performance in specific subject areas. At Harrison High School, 100 percent of $11^{\text {th }}$ graders passed the Mathematics test; Lassiter, Pope and Walton were close behind with 99 percent (see Table I). Walton High School also had 75 percent or more of students attain the advanced proficiency status in all four subject tests. Lassiter and Pope high schools each had more than 80 percent of 11 th graders reach advanced proficiency status in English-Language Arts and Math (See Table II).

As part of the statewide testing program, 11th grade students are administered the GHSGT each spring. They are tested in four subject areas - English-Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies - and each section must be passed to earn a Georgia high school diploma. Scores range from 100 to 300 , with 200 as a passing score in English Language Arts, Science and Social Studies. The scores for Math range from 400 to 600, with 500 as passing. Results for the system, state, metro area (RESA- Regional Educational Service Agencies) and individual schools are listed in Table I. Tables IIIA - IIID provide program summary data for each content area tested.

Georgia law (O.C.G.A. §20-2-281 G, (a) mandates that a "curriculum-based assessment be administered in grade 11 for graduation purposes" and (c) "that the State Board of Education shall have the authority to condition the awarding of a high school diploma to a student upon achievement of satisfactory scores on instruments or tests adopted and administered by the State board pursuant to (a) of this code." The law further provides opportunities for students with disabilities "to take any test adopted by the State Board as a condition for awarding of a high school diploma" and to receive accommodations specified in their IEP as necessary for participation.

The Georgia High School Graduation Tests (GHSGT) assess only a sample of the knowledge and skills that educators agree comprise a complete high school education. Georgia students have opportunities to learn and are expected to master - much more than the tests address. The state adopted curriculum is the source of the knowledge and skills assessed on the graduation tests.

Students take the GHSGT for the first time in the spring of the $11^{\text {th }}$ grade. Schools use the results to identify students who need additional instruction in the academic content determined by Georgia educators as necessary for a high school diploma. Students who do not succeed on their first attempt have four additional opportunities to meet the standards prior to completing $12^{\text {th }}$ grade.

Tests based solely on the Georgia Performance Standards (GPS) were administered in English Language Arts, Science and Social Studies to grade 11 first-time test takers in the Spring 2010 Administration. The Math portion of the Graduation Tests is currently based on the older QCC standards.

At the district level, the percentage of Regular Program students passing the English Language Arts test remained unchanged at ninety-six (96) percent from 2009 to 2010. Scores for Special Education students declined from seventy-six (76) percent passing to seventy-one (71) percent. Similarly, scores for English Language Learners dropped from sixty-three (63) percent passing to sixty (60) percent.

On the Math portion of the Graduation Test, the percentage of Regular Program students passing dropped only two (2) percentage points to ninety-six (96) percent from ninety-eight (98) percent last year, while scores for Special Education students dropped eleven (11) points from eight-four (84) percent to seventythree (73) percent. English Language Learners passing the test declined nine (9) percent from eighty-eight (88) percent to seventy-nine (79) percent.

District scores for Science showed little change from 2009. Overall scale scores increased one point from 243 to 244 . The percentage of Regular Program students passing the test stayed the same as last year at $93 \%$. Special Education student scores were unchanged at seventy-one (71) percent, although the percent of English Language Learners passing increased six (6) points from fifty-seven (57) percent to sixty-three (63) percent.

There was a significant drop in Social Studies percentages, primarily because of the testing transition to Georgia Performance Standards. The percentage of Regular Program students passing decreased from 92\% in 2009 to $86 \%$ in 2010 (decline of 6\%), from $71 \%$ to $57 \%$ for Special Education (decline of $14 \%$ ), and from 59\% to 42\% (decline of 17\%) for English Language Learners.

## Key Findings

## ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

O A total of 6,812 Regular Program Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the ELA test. Ninety-six (96) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 248. This is lower than the previous year's scale score of 249.
o A total of 564 Special Education Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the ELA test. Seventy-one (71) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 216. The percent of Special Education students passing in 2009 was $76 \%$, with a scale score of 218.

O A total of 196 English Language Learner Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the ELA test. Sixty (60) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 205. Last year, $63 \%$ of the English language learners met the passing standard with a scale score of 205.

## Mathematics

O A total of 6,815 Regular Program Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Mathematics test. Ninety-six (96) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 542 . This number reflects a slightly lower scale score than that of 2009 by two points, as well as a decline of two percentage points in the number of students passing.

O A total of 564 Special Education Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Mathematics test. Seventy-three (73) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 515 . The percentage of students passing the test decreased eleven percent (from 84 to 73 ) and the scale score was 515, five points lower than the 2009 score of 520.

O A total of 200 English Language Learner Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Mathematics test. Seventynine (79) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 515 . The percentage of students passing decreased by nine percentage points (from 88 to 79) while the mean scale score decreased by five points from the previous year (520 to 515).

## Science

o A total 6,805 of Regular Program Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Science test. Ninty-three (93) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 244 . The average scale score for 2010 increased by one point over 2009 (from 243 to 244).
o A total of 562 Special Education Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Science test. Seventy-one (71) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 217. The percentage of students passing remained unchanged from the previous year at $71 \%$, although the average scale score decreased by 2 points.
o A total of 201 English Language Learner Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Science test. Sixty-three (63) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 210 . The average scale score for 2010 is 2 points higher than last year at 208 and the number of students meeting standards is 6 points higher than last year (63\%).

## SOCIAL STUDIES

o A total of 6,753 Regular Program Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Social Studies test. Eighty-six (86) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 245 . The percentage of students passing decreased by 6 percentage points from the previous year (from 92 to 86 ).
o A total of 556 Special Education Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Social Studies test. Fifty-seven (57) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 213. The percentage of students passing decreased by 14 percentage points from the previous year (from 71 to 57 ).
o A total of 194 English Language Learner Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Social Studies test. Forty-two (42) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 201. The percentage of students passing decreased by 17 percentage points from last year (from 59 to 42 ).
o Due to the shift in standards tested from QCC to GPS, scale scores cannot be compared from 2009 to 2010.
