What Is Title I?

Compton Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act of 1965 (ESSA). What is it?

Compton Elementary has jointly developed this policy with our parents to describe how we will support the important role of parents and families in the education of their children. Compton values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes how Compton will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities to promote student learning at home and at school.

How is it revised?

Compton Elementary invited all parents to attend our annual School Input Meeting last spring to review and revise the parental involvement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-family compacts, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year by completing various parent surveys throughout the year, completing a parent input form (located in Parent Resource Center) or by contacting **Christan Crear at christan.crear@cobbk12.org**.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this Policy. Compton Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children. In cases where the students reside in a Neglected and Delinquent residential facility, a representative from that facility can serve as a proxy for the parent(s).

Where is it available?

The Plan is always available on the School's Web site. In addition, parents receive a copy of the plan during Parent-Teacher conferences in October. Additional copies of the plan are available in Compton's front lobby.

2019-2020 District Goals

- By the end of the 2021-2022 school year, 100% of the schools and district will use our collaborative data-driven process, Cobb Collaborative Community (CCC), with fidelity to improve learning.
- CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/ programs by 10% as measured by ParentVUE data, survey results, and web review module.
- By the end of the 2019-2020 school year, 100% of the schools and district will use a common assessment to measure the impact of professional learning which will, in turn guide decisions on how best to support teachers and leaders in high poverty/needs schools.
- By the end of the 2022 school year, increase effective implementation of lulti-tiered systems of support by increasing access to programs/resources to prepare students for college and careers as measured by participation rates.

2019-2020 School Goals

- The Reading Inventory will increase by 5% at each grade level (3-5) from August 2019 to May 2020.
- The Fountas and Pinnell Benchmark Assessment System will increase by 5% at each grade level (K-2) from August 2019 to May 2020.
- The percent of students performing at or above grade level proficiency on the EOY Math Inventory will increase by 7% at each grade level (K-5) from August 2018 to May 2019.
- The Milestone Math Assessment (grades 3-5) will increase from 34% (Level 3 & 4) to 41% (Level 3 & 4).

- Holding meetings during the school day and outside school hours to address scheduling needs of working families.
- 8. Addressing all concerns and suggestions in a timely manner. Concerns and suggestions regarding the Title 1 Plan will be submitted to the Title 1 office.
- 9. Consistently communicate academic progress with families.
- 10. Providing a Parent Resource Room located in room 1.049 (directly behind the front lobby where materials are provided for check out and computers maybe utilized by parents).
- 11. Providing transitioning activities such as Parent Orientation and Coffee, Tea & Sympathy for new Kindergarten students.
