

What is Title I?


Garrett Middle School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental engagement policy.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Garrett Middle School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Garrett Middle School values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Garrett Middle School will support family engagement. Additionally, the plan describes how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

Garrett Middle School invited all parents to attend our annual School Forum last spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Community Cares event.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children. In cases where the students reside in a Neglected and Delinquent residential facility, a representative from that facility can serve as a proxy for the parent(s).

Where is it available?

The policy will be distributed at parent/teacher conference week to all parents. The plan will also be posted on the school website at www.cobbk12.org/garrett. Also, parents can always retrieve a copy of the plan in the front office.

2021 - 2022 District Goals

1. Increase student performance in all core content areas by 2% annually as measured by achievement data.
2. CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/programs by 10% as measured by CTLS Parent data, survey results & web view module.
3. By 2023, we will reorganize the PL framework to meet the needs of all schools to ensure alignment with Superintendent Priorities as measured by PL opportunities, surveys, and student achievement.
4. By the end of 2025 school year every school will have identified practices and resources that support student success as measured by student academic, perception or discipline data.

2021-22 School Goals/Focus Areas

- *The number of English Language Arts students scoring proficient or higher will increase by 15% from the 2021-2022 school year, as measured by the Reading Inventory school-wide. *Focus-Developing strong reading strategies*
- *The number of Math students scoring proficient or higher will increase by 15% from 2021-2022 school year, as measured by the Math Inventory school-wide. *Focus-Understanding Math computation*
- *By the end of the 2021-2022 school year, 85% of students will receive no more than one referral. *Focus-Positive class behavior*

Parents will have an opportunity to collaborate with your child(ren) to integrate math and science with real-world application. The workshops will concentrate on Math and Literacy.


Spring School Improvement Forum – April 20, 2022

- That parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child.



Garrett Middle is Branching Out!

Garrett Middle will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- ✓ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, posted on the school website and sent home.
- ✓ Provide trainings for staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement with reading and math activities for our students outside of the classroom. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
- ✓ Continue our 6th and 8th grade transitional camp program by sending school information about parent engagement activities, to help prepare families for middle school and improve school transition.
- ✓ Share information in English and Spanish for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
