

What is Title 1?

- Title 1 is the Nation's Largest Federal Assistance Program for schools
- The goal of Title 1 is to get every child a high-quality education.
- Schools participating in the Title I program receive funds based on the percentage of students qualifying for free or reduced-price school meals.
- Parent Involvement is a focal point to Title 1.
- Workshops and schoolwide events are offered to build the capacity of families to support their children academically.

Title 1 Funds



Each district is required to reserve at least one percent of its Title I funds to carry out parent and family engagement activities, including those described in the parent and family engagement policy.



Ninety (90) percent of the Title I funds must be distributed to schools, with priority given to "high-need" schools. The law further requires that parents and family members of students must be included in decisions regarding how these engagement funds are spent.



Parents have a voice in what is done in the school and when the parents respond, the school knows what direction can be taken to achieve the maximum compatibility between home and community.

- 1) 15% of students will increase by a **literacy** proficiency band from August 2021 administration to the May 2022 administration for grades 6-8.
- 2) 15% of students will increase by a **numeracy** proficiency band from August 2021 administration to the May 2022 administration for grades 6-8.

What is Title I?

Griffin Middle School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards in reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. The Title I program must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support protected introduced.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Griffin Middle School will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Griffin Middle School values the contributions of parents to an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement.
