- A student shall be eligible to participate in the program if he/she:
 1. Is enrolled in a Cobb County School District high school, and
- 2. Has not received a high school diploma, and

- 4. Is within the four years required to complete the high school diploma (eligibility concludes at the end of Spring term four years after 9th grade entry).

STUDENT PARTICIPATION:

- Please note: DE Colleges do NOT follow the Cobb County School District calendar.
- Additionally, DE Students are NOT to loiter on the CCSD campuses when the college class is not in session.
- Finally, part-time DE Students need to be flexible regarding your CCSD and college schedule. Your college courses should be scheduled around your CCSD courses.

Participation in the program requires the student to:

- 1. Maintain regular communication with the student's high school counselor while in any DE program.
- Meet with the high school counselor each semester to complete the DE Student Participation/Advisement Agreement.
- 3. Provide to the high school a copy of the DE Local School Agreement (Must be received prior to attending first DE class).
- 4. Provide to the high school a copy of the detailed college schedule upon class registration. (Must be received prior to financial aid payment.)
- 5. Complete DE financial aid application (electronic through www.gafutures.org or paper if student does not have SSN) by the posted deadline. (Must be completed prior to financial aid payment.)
- 6. Obtain DE high school counselor approval before any changes are made to the college schedule.
- 7. Follow the rules and regulations of the college and Cobb County School District.
- 8. Request and sign any forms needed to authorize the college to notify CCSD of the student's grade in each course.
- 9. Provide his/her own transportation.
 - a. Students are expected to still arrive on time to all High School courses. Please allow for appropriate travel time.
 - b. Parking will not be guaranteed for DE students.
- 10. Complete all required courses for high school graduation.
- 11. Ensure high school receives official college grades by stated deadline in order to participate in graduation activities.

STATE ASSESSMENT

- With the exception of 9th Grade Literature and Composition, Algebra I, Geometry, and Biology, students are exempt from taking the Georgia Milestones End-of-Course assessment for a core subject course if they earn a post-secondary credit in that course through dual enrollment. End-of-Course assessments count 20% of the final grade.
- The courses taken by the student at the college may contain some but not all of the concepts and topics taught in high school.

___ COURSE CREDIT

- 1. The student must be classified as a full-time student for fall and spring semesters. Full time status can be established in multiple ways: 1) By the student taking classes totaling a minimum of four (4.0) high school credits per semester (block) between the high school and the college, 2) By the student taking classes totaling a minimum of three (3.0) high school credits per semester (traditional) between the high school and the college, or 3) By the student taking at least a total of 12 hour credits if the student is attending the college on a full time basis.
 - a. Please note that the maximum number of hours that are covered by DE is a total of 15 credit hours.
 - b. Students who select option 1) or option 2) and are in the fourth year of high school may reduce the schedule by taking minimum day according to Board Policy IED-R. This is not an option for students who are selecting option 3) and attending the college full-time based on the state regulations for full-time dual enrollment requirements.
 - i. Students who take advantage of minimum day must take at least one high school credit-bearing course.
- The semester/quarter hours awarded by the postsecondary institution will be converted to Carnegie Units on the student's transcript.

- Most grades earned at the college will not receive additional quality points toward the high school GPA; however, additional quality points will be given for college courses after the student has taken the highest instructional level in a specific subject area available at their high school (CCSD Admin Rule IDCH-R). This will potentially impact GPA and class rank. Students should consider course selection carefully.
- Duplicate courses cannot be taken at the college level, even if the postsecondary school makes this recommendation.

	COURSE INCOMPLETION, WITHDRAWAL, OR FAILURE
1.	If a student withdraws from a course after the first ten days of the <u>CCSD High School term</u> regardless of the college drop/add and withdrawal policies, the withdrawing student will receive the grade of 10 in the course, which shall be recorded on the transcript
	(CCSD Admin Rule IHF-R).
2.	A student's graduation may be delayed if:
	• A student withdraws from or fails a course needed for graduation.
	• A course is audited rather than taken for credit.
	• A student withdraws from a college class or fails a college class needed for graduation and is unable to enroll in a district high
	school or college course that will allow on-time graduation. Not every course is offered every semester.
	 A student withdraws from a college class and enters a high school class, potentially missing course content.
	/ COMPETITIVE ACTIVITIES
	"To be eligible to participate, practice, and/or try out in interscholastic activities, a student must be academically eligible.
	A student is required to pass classes that carry the equivalent of at least 2.5 Carnegie Units counting toward graduation the
	semester immediately preceding participation" (Georgia High School Association Constitution and By-Laws). Other
	eligibility concerns may be confirmed with the athletic director. Students and parents will need to consider whether practices, games, etc. will interfere with the completion of postsecondary course requirements.

	• Fall – College application is due by May 1 ; Funding application is due by August 1 .
	• Spring – College application is due by November 1 ; funding application is due by January 7 .
	 Summer – College application and funding application are both due by May 1.
2.	Students may be responsible for additional fees or supplies required for particular courses or optional fees charged by the
2	postsecondary institution.
3.	The student is responsible for tuition and fees for any course taken that is not in the DE approved course directory or the student's DE application. These courses will not be recorded on the high school transcript.
4.	DE courses in core subjects (or those on the HOPE eligible list found at www.gafutures.org) are included in determining a
т.	student's High School HOPE GPA. The DE courses are given an additional 0.5 weight in the High School HOPE GPA

5.	DE courses are NOT included in student's college HOPE/Zell Miller GPA checkpoint calculations, attempted hours, and/or
