Cobb Schools Foundation

The Cobb Schools Foundation is a non-profit organization governed by a volunteer Board of Trustees separate from the Cobb County School Board of Education, established to support the needs of students across Cobb County. It is different from Keheley's Foundation, because it supports ALL Cobb families and students and is primarily funded by businesses, corporations, and family donations. The School Schools Foundation's reach is among nearly 108,000 students, located throughout 112 schools. Their three priorities for all Cobb students are Family Stabilization, Learning Interventions and Scholarships. Keheley's School Counseling Program

The mission of the CCSD counseling program is to assist students in overcoming barriers that impede learning. School Counselors implement a standards-based comprehensive program including:

- Classroom Curriculum The classroom instructional topics include Academic, Interpersonal and Personal Skills. Counseling Lessons are taught in every classroom every other week.
- Individual Contact- students can request an appointment with the counselor as needed.
- Small Group Counseling Sessions- students who need additional support each week.
- Parent Consultation the counselor is available to assist parents with concerns regarding their student.
- Responsive Services- the counselor responds to the needs of students, staff and community.


Feel Good Friday
