








If you are worried about a friend/peer, notify a counselor immediately.

HOPE Scholarship Program

What is HOPE?

(Helping Outstanding Pupils Educationally)

These are scholarships that are awarded to Georgia residents who have demonstrated specific academic achievements. These scholarships assist students with paying for their tuition at any USG, TCSG, or eligible private colleges or universities in Georgia. The criteria varies for each scholarship; however, this is a great way for students to get help with paying for their post-secondary education!

HOPE SCHOLARSHIP

- · Be a U.S. Citizen or meet non-citizen requirements
- · Must be a Georgia resident for at least one year
- Must graduate from a Georgia High School
- Must pass 4 rigor classes
- Must have a minimum of a 3.0 HOPE GPA upon graduation
- Must have your SSN updated in CCSD student record

HOPE Scholarship Program

What are rigor courses?

Some graduation requirements qualify as rigorous courses. As you are registering for 11th and 12th grade, keep these courses in mind. Example of rigor courses are:

- Math (Algebra II, Pre-Calc, AFA)
- Science (Physics, Chemistry)
- AP Classes
- Dual Enrollment classes
- Foreign Language (Level 2 and higher)

HOPE Grant Program

HOPE GRANT

- Be a U.S. Citizen or meet non-citizen requirements
- Must be a Georgia resident for at least one year
- No GPA requirement
- Test scores not required
- Eligible for students working towards a certificate or diploma at a technical college

HOPE Grant Program

HOPE CAREER GRANT

- Must be a recipient of HOPE or Zell Miller Grant
- Eligible for students working towards a certificate or diploma at a technical college in programs that are in high demand career fields

Fixed award amount based on program and number of enrollment hours.

HOPE GPA= The average of your core classes (English, math, science, social studies), foreign language classes, and some computer science classes!




Select the high school that you are currently attending.

What are the SAT and ACT? Why are they important?

TESTING

The SAT and ACT are standardized tests that colleges use to determine how prepared you are to take college-level courses. Depending on the institution and your high school GPA, the college/university might require these tests for admissions. The SAT and ACT can also open the door for scholarships!





PSAT

Cobb County affords all 10th grade students the opportunity to take the PSAT. This exam is designed to prepare you for the SAT. You can also visit College Board to take additional practice tests!

SAT

You can register for the SAT through College Board. The test has 4 sections: reading, writing, math with a calculator, and math without a calculator. Keep in mind any deadlines when registering!

To access your PSAT scores and register for the SAT, visit CollegeBoard.org!

During your junior year, contact your counselor to see if you qualify for fee waivers

ACT

PRE ACT

Some schools offer the PreACT to their students. The PreACT can provide insight into your performance on the ACT. You can also take practice ACT tests on ACT.org!

ACT

You can register for the ACT through ACT.org. The test has 4 sections: English, math, reading, and science. Keep in mind any deadlines when registering!


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ASVAB

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) is an exam that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military. This exam is available to *all* students who seek information about their skill set.

What is Dual Enrollment?



Dual Enrollment is a state-funded program that allows you to take college-level courses while completing your high school diploma.

This program pays for 100% of tuition, mandatory fees, and any required textbooks.

You can earn up to 30 credit hours!

Basically... You can earn college credits while still in high school!

Dual Enrollment provides limited options for 10th graders.

Any 10th grader is able to take a CTAE class at a Technical College.

2.

Those 10th grader who earn a 1200 SAT or 26 ACT (in one sitting) are able to apply to participating Dual Enrollment programs.

Interested in Dual Enrollment?

STEP 1

Attend a DE Hawk Hour!

(Attend informational sessions, visit website, review presentations, etc.)

STEP 2

Research specific requirements and application deadlines for the college you are interested in attending as a dual enrollment student.

Interested in Dual Enrollment?

STEP 3

Apply and submit documents

(Submit application, send SAT/ACT scores, request transcript from Counseling Office, and any other required documents)

STEP 4

Meet with your counselor to complete paperwork and discuss what courses to take!

Important things to consider...

- Will your college of interest accept these credits?
- DE vs. AP
- Full time vs. Part time participation
- Transportation to the college might be necessary
- Scheduling conflicts
 - In-school and extracurricular responsibilities
- Cobb County and College calendars are different
 - o Breaks, exam dates, etc.


- You can access Naviance from the CCSD homepage and your school's website.





Click on "My Account".

Go to your Contact section and click "Edit".



Start with the "Strengths Explorer" assessment but both tasks need to be completed




This pink arrow indicates where you can click to begin both tasks.






Once finished, click on "See Related Career Pathways" at the bottom.
