

APUSH Summer Assignment – Summer 2022-2023

Welcome to AP United States History! For your summer assignment, you will not be reading a book, but interacting with US History in a different way. You are being asked to visit a museum, national park, or national monument over the summer. You must choose a place that has an exhibit **dealing with some aspect of the nation's past**. State history would also count as a part of our nation's past. Exhibits can depict aspects of political, economic, religious, social, intellectual, or artistic movements in United States history.

For the assignment, you will need to...

- Write a 2 page paper, double spaced, 12 pt. Times New Roman font essay. The paper should be divided into 2 parts. PLEASE DIVIDE OUT AND LABEL EACH PART IN YOUR ESSAY (label "Part 1: Summary" on the first page and label "Part 2: *whichever category that you pick*" on the second page)! Each part should be 1 page, which together makes up your 2 page essay ☺
 - Part 1: Give a summary of the events depicted in the museum, national monument, or national park and why it is significant in American history.
 - Part 2: Explain how the events depicted in the museum, national monument, or national park show how our nation has evolved today. This evolution MUST be categorized as ONE of the following: **political, economic, religious, social, intellectual or artistic**. Please make your category easily identifiable!!!
- Staple the ticket or a brochure from your museum, national monument, or national park to your written paper.

The essay is due on AUGUST 12th for Fall Semester students AND JANUARY 13th for Spring Semester students.

The museum can be in Atlanta, in Georgia, or outside the state. For ideas, check out tourism department website from the state, or from surrounding states. You may also refer to the list of area museums and exhibits on this handout. You may visit more than one museum and multiple exhibits in a museum. (See below for museums, national parks, and national monuments nearby.)

Summer Assignment Essay Rubric

Section of Paper	Questions to Answer	5	3	1
Summary	Where did you go? What did you see? When or what time period would this historical site / museum have its historical significance?	Clear explanation of where you went as well as when the historical events depicted at the site.	Vague time period given and a brief description of the historical site.	No real explanation of where you went or when this historical site / museum was relevant.
Summary	Why or how does this place (or the events that happened at this place) have an impact on our overall American history?	Explains in detail how or why this place had an impact on the overall history of America.	Briefly explains how or why this place has an impact on the overall history of America.	A weak or vague explanation of how the place had an impact on the overall history of America.
Category	How does this place connect to the category that you chose? *Political / Economic / Social / Intellectual / Religious / Artistic	There is a clear connection made between the historical site and the category chosen.	Connection between the category and the historical site was not fully addressed or not completely clear.	There is no connection made between the historical site and the category chosen OR there was no category chosen to connect too.
Category	How has this connection impact our world today?	Connection between historical site / museum and the category chosen, clearly connects to today's society.
