2023 Summer Reading - Rising 7th Graders Due Date: August 7, 2023

Requirement: Select from one (1) of the novels below. **Identify** a main or secondary character's predominant (most noticeable) personality trait*. For example, the character might exhibit greed or generosity or compassion. (Students are not limited to these character traits.) Then, **find** three quotations [one in the beginning of the novel, one in the middle, and one at the end] to support the trait; **record** them using quotation marks and parenthetical citations of page numbers. Finally, for each quotation, **write** a paragraph of explanation or clarification to support the choice. Remember to write with **third person** pronouns. All of this should be **typed and saved** in One Drive. **NOTE:** the attached sheets may be used for your rough draft. An example of the required assignment can be found on the last page. **THIS ASSIGNMENT WILL BE GRADED.**

*Sample personality traits: greed, generosity, compassion, malice, determination, loyalty, hardworking, cooperative, patience, bravery, observant, cautious, trustworthy, responsible, demanding, stubborn, impatient, arrogance, dishonesty, etc...

Explanation: Never concerned about the size or age of her opponent, Squeaky confronts her offenders eager for a fight. Youngsters can be cruel, and Squeaky more than likely endures stares and insults about Raymond daily. She could choose to ignore the comments and stares, take a deep relaxing breath, and walk away, but she does not—she is combatant and enjoys confrontations. Alternatively, Squeaky could propose to the offenders that they treat her brother more compassionately. After all, she could remind them, Raymond is cognitively disabled and needs help, not hurt. Instead, she allows her warlike nature to dominate. She is often engaged in altercations.
