District Goals for Student Achievement

- Increase student performance in all core content areas by 2% annually as measured by achievement data.
- CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/programs by 10% as measured by CLTS Parent data, survey results & web view module.
- By 2024, we will implement the PL framework to meet the needs of all schools to ensure alignment with Superintendent Priorities as measured by Pl opportunities, surveys, and student achievement.
- By the end of the 2025 school year, every school will have identified practices and resources that support student success as measured by student achievement, perception and discipline data.

Clarkdale Elementary Goal(s) for Student Achievement Goal #1:

Increase the percentage of students performing at the proficient and advance levels on the Reading Inventory (RI) from 43% (519 of 510 students) at the end of 2023 school year to 50% of assessed students by the end of 2024 school year.

Goal #2:

Increase the percentage of students performing at the proficient and advanced levels on the Math Inventory (MI) assessment from 66 % (436 of 664 students) at the end of 2023 school year to 71% of assessed students by the end of 2024 school year.

<u>Goal #3</u>

Increase the percentage of 3-5 students performing at the Monitor and Accelerate Learning levels in writing, as measured by the EOG, from 44% (155 of 352 students) at the end of 2023 school year to 49% of assessed students by the end of 2024 school year.

*Grades 3-5 will focus on vocabulary acquisition, reading comprehension and fact fluency.
