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How can I best support my 5th grader?

- -How can I best support my child with their homework? Level of support recommended?

How can I best support my 5th grader?

- -Students should be completing homework mostly independently at this age/grade.
 - They will benefit the most from a quick, nightly check-in routine of some sort to ensure they completed nightly homework. The simple understanding that you as their parent are aware they have nightly homework & have an active role in their accountability will benefit them greatly.
- -Weekly time scheduled for students to organize/clean out their own binder (please do not ever purge your child's binder for them)
- -Bookbag should never be full of "school guts" everything has a home in the binder, journal, or pencil pouch (please do not ever purge your child's bookbag for them)
- -Any materials left at home should **not** be brought to school during the school day.
- -Recommended weekly routines: check/discuss grades, sign behavior log, sign graded work packet, clean out binder/bookbag.
- -Communicate with us The more we know, the better we can support you and your child. ©

Grading Policy

CCSD's Scale Score for Letter Grades

- A- 90% 100%
- B- 80% 89%
- C- 74% 79%
- D- 70%-73%
- F- 69% or below

Grades are weighted into the following categories:

- Classwork: 20% of overall grade
- Quizzes: 20% of overall grade
- Performance Tasks: 30% of overall grade
- Tests: 30% of overall grade

Grades

- Actively monitor grades through ParentVUE at least once a week
- ■Students should actively monitor grades through StudentVUE - 2-3 times a week
- •Graded work sent home on Fridays (but not every week)
- ■50% in the gradebook represents missing assignment or scores less than 50% read notes from teacher in comment section to determine if it is missing or a 50 is the actual grade.
- Late work will be accepted up to one week after initial due date.
- ■Request to retest Math, science, social studies tests & reading quizzes only.

Homework



Students are given time to write down homework EVERY SINGLE DAY in their agendas.




Average of 50 minutes per night (may be different at start of year & may take some longer than others)

- -Math: show work on scratch paper & bring it to school daily
- -Geography: Do independent research
- -Reading routine: nightly reading with a family member, aloud, independently (just reading something)

Geography, grammar, and math are assigned every single night. These require good time management & studying of content.

Do not wait until the night before to begin.

MATH, SCIENCE, SS STUDY GUIDES <u>WILL NOT</u> BE EXACT REPLICAS OF TESTS. WILL INCLUDE LIST OF CONCEPTS TO BE STUDIED & REQUIRE STUDENTS TO TAKE INITIATIVE FOR REVIEWING

ORGANIZATION – BINDER CHECKS WILL RANDOMLY HAPPEN IN THE CLASSROOM. PLEASE SET UP A SYSTEM AT HOME TO REGULARLY HAVE YOUR CHILD CLEAN THEIR BINDER & BOOKBAG.



Study Habits & Grades

Students' work ethic/study habits will be monitored by teachers. Homework, work effort, and missing/late assignments are all considered to determine a student's work/study habits grade on the quarterly **report card**.

- In a nine-week's period:
 - 0-5 occurrences in any of these categories will result in an S on the report card
 - 6-9 occurrences in any of these categories will result in an N on the report card
 - 9 or more occurrences in any of these categories will result in a U on the report card
 - More than 5 occurrences in the Quarter will make a student ineligible to receive academic awards at the end of the year.
 - If a child earns a <u>C or below</u> in a specialist class, he/she will be ineligible for academic awards at the end of the year.

Behavior



Behavior will be noted on the quarterly Behavior Report that will be stapled into each student's agenda and must be signed by a parent weekly.

0 – 5 occurrences – S on report card

6 – 9 occurrences - N on report card

9 or more occurrences – U on report card



If a student receives more than 5 behavior specific marks on the quarterly behavior report, including during specials, they will be ineligible for <u>academic awards</u> at the end of the year. This can only be monitored by checking the behavior sheet. Parents are responsible for checking & signing it every single weekend.
