MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

H.A.V.E.N. ACADEMY

WHEREAS, the Georgia Department of Education administers a psychoeducational network known as the Georgia Network for Educational and Therapeutic Support (GNETS), which consists of 24 programs statewide providing comprehensive special education services and therapeutic support for students with severe emotional behavior disorders and autism; and

WHEREAS, H.A.V.E.N. Academy is a GNETS program serving the needs of CCSD, MCS, and Douglas County School District (DCSD) students, both through campus-based programs (H.A.V.E.N Academy at Sky View) and at various satellite locations at CCSD and DCSD facilities; and

WHEREAS, CCSD is the designated fiscal agent for H.A.V.E.N. Academy; and

WHEREAS, in the spirit of cooperation and the future direction of H.A.V.E.N. Academy, the parties find it necessary and desirous to memorialize their respective rights and obligations in this MOU as follows:

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises of the parties hereto, the parties agree as follows:

CCSD will continue to serve as the designated fiscal agent for H.A.V.E.N. Academy to administer funding provided by the State of Georgia through GNETS and operate the campusbased program at H.A.V.E.N Academy at Sky View.

2.

MCS will continue to send MCS students eligible for H.A.V.E.N. Academy to the CCSD campus-based or satellite programs, whichever is deemed appropriate. MCS will hire and assign paraprofessionals to assist and oversee MCS students and will coordinate with H.A.V.E.N. Academy administrators with regard to the number and placement of the MCS paraprofessionals. The hiring of MCS paraprofessionals will be based upon the number of MCS students who require 1:1 paraprofessionals. Classroom paraprofessionals will be provided by CCSD.

3.

MCS paraprofessionals working in CCSD facilities shall be strictly deemed employees of MCS and in no event employees of CCSD. However, for the sake of orderliness and consistency, MCS employees shall be subject to all CCSD rules, policies, and procedures and, if at a satellite location, the rules, policies, and procedures of that school and the leadership of the school's principal. If the Principal of any CCSD facility where an MCS paraprofessional is assigned investigates and finds an MCS paraprofessional to be in violation of any rule, policy, or procedure, such Principal shall notify the MCS Director of Special Education. However, the Principal shall have the ultimate responsibility for investigating the issue and determining and sharing an action recommendation with MCS. The principal shall further have the discretion to remove any such paraprofessional from such location. In such event, MCS shall be solely

responsible for any disciplinary or other actions affecting such employee's employment but will not further assign the employee to the H.A.V.E.N. Academy. CCSD and MCS will cooperate to the extent necessary to ensure that annual reviews and the like are completed in a format approved by MCS, by onsite personnel supervising the MCS paraprofessionals.

4.

MCS students attending school at CCSD facilities pursuant to H.A.V.E.N. Academy, while remaining students of their respective school districts, shall be subject to all rules, policies, and procedures governing CCSD students. The parties will cooperate to the extent necessary so that report cards, individualized education programs, and the like, while prepared by CCSD personnel, will be completed in the format provided by MCS for its respective students.

5.

MCS will be solely responsible for the transportation of its respective students attending CCSD facilities to and from school. CCSD will be responsible for any additional transportation within the school day such as field trips and community based instruction.

6.

In the event a request is received pursuant to the Georgia Open Records Act pertaining to MCS students or MCS paraprofessionals in H.A.V.E.N. Academy, MCS or will collaborate with CCSD to ensure a timely response.

MCS will contribute the sum of up-to THIRTY THOUSAND AND NO/100THS DOLLARS (\$30,000.00) to CCSD earmarked for H.A.V.E.N. Academy for the 2016-2017 school year. H.A.V.E.N. Academy will bill MCS biannually for students attending the program. Attendance will be a taken during the FTE October count and Child count in March. Students who have been enrolled 20 days in the HAVEN program will be considered enrolled in the HAVEN program. MCS will pay HAVEN \$750.00 per student each semester who have enrolled in the program for a minimal of 20 days. The invoices will be sent directly to Accounts Payable in MCS and will be reviewed by MCS Director of Special Education for approval. After approved, the payment will be processed. CCSD shall use such funds exclusively for expenses incurred in administering H.A.V.E.N., including but not limited to the following:

- (a) Substitute coverage for MCS staff at H.A.V.E.N. Academy;
- (b) Awards, rewards, token purchases and other student incentives;
- (c) Program-wide enhancement and events (such as stakeholders' annual meeting supplies therefore);
- (d) Garden supplies, Practical Assessment Exploration System (PAES) Lab, and custodial supplies and equipment.

8.

Nothing in this MOU is intended to conflict with current laws or regulations of the United States of America, or the State of Georgia. If a term of this agreement is inconsistent with such authority, then that term shall be invalid, but the remaining terms and conditions of this MOU shall remain in full force and effect. This MOU shall become effective upon adoption and execution by both parties and may be modified upon the mutual written consent of the parties.

10.

While this MOU is intended to apply to the 2016-2017 school year, it shall be renewable each year and revised in accordance with the changing needs of H.A.V.E.N. Academy.

After School Program Scholarships- \$ 18,713.00 to help fund After School Program scholarships for kids in need to attend the ASP program at their school. Cost per student is set by the school district at \$7 per day. A cap of \$200.00 per family per semester is available. Funds will also assist in funding administrative assistant to manage the ASP scholarship application program.

Project 2400/Success 1600- \$ 20,000.00 to fund SAT prep classes for high school juniors. Funds will be used to contract Princeton Review to continue to teach the courses at each of our 16 high schools, allowing for no cost to the students. Due to budget cuts, the Cobb County School District has had to reduce the funding to 50% (\$62,500). The Foundation will be providing the other 50% (\$62,500). Total cost of the program is \$325.00 per student for 24 students at each of our 16 high schools is \$ 125,000.00

Bully Prevention- \$ 14,685.00 will be used to support Bullying Prevention efforts in Cobb County School District. Cobb Schools will implement a variety of evidence-based and best practice programs and strategies to reduce bullying behavior including the Olweus Bullying Prevention Program, Restorative Practices, and Sources of Strength Youth Leadership Program. Each school has a unique culture/climate and programs must be tailored for each school. Funds will be used to pay for curriculum and supplies for program implementation, contracted salaries for staff training and substitute teachers to attend the training and travel expenses.
