Set the tone for success and monitor your students.

Observe and identify problem behavior

Is it a crisis situation?
(Immediate danger to a student/staff member or an emergency, including fighting, weapons, unsafe behavior)
CALL FRONT OFFICE!

Is the behavior teacher or office managed?

Teacher Managed

Office Managed

Redirect student behavior (warning)

1st offense- Remind student of appropriate behavior and of potential +/- consequences
(Problem Solving Sheet)

2nd offense- Problem Solving Sheet plus minor infraction (parent contacted) entered in PBIS Rewards

Did the behavior change?

Acknowledge and reward appropriate behavior which starts back at step 1

Implement new strategy to address problem behavior (use PBIS Toolbox)

3rd offense - Problem Solving Sheet plus possible office referral (Contact PBIS Behavior Team)
