### **ACT Benchmarks**

The ACT has established benchmark scores - minimum score needed on an ACT subject-area test to indicate a 50% chance of obtaining a B or higher.

- English Composition 18 on the ACT (87% of our test takers scored above 18)
- College Algebra 22 on the ACT (75% of our test takers scored above 22)
- Social Science 22 on the Reading (68% of our test takers scored above 22 on the Reading test)
- Biology 23 on the Science (63% of our test takers scored above 23 on the Science test) 53% of our test takers meet all 4 benchmarks
