How can I support my AVID Student at home?

In AVID we have several practices that enable students to be successful in all classes. Family members can support students by encouraging the use of these practices at home. Suggestions include:

- regular basis. We require all AVID students to keep a 2" binder with all course work for all classes. Contents include a weekly calendar, a pencil pouch, divided sections for each class (with six sections for AVID), class notes, handouts, and graded work for each class.

 This binder is central to the organizational aspect of AVID.
- Encourage your student's use of Focused
 Note Taking in all classes and for studying,
 even when notes are not required.

- Encourage annotating (marking) texts for studying and the initial reading of material.
- Encourage participation in AVID field trips and activities.
