How Do I Build My College List?

- ► Know <u>your</u> academic profile
 - ► Core, **unweighted** GPA
 - Standardized test scores
 - ► Curriculum (rigor)
- Search for the college's freshman profile
 - ▶ Average or mid 50% GPA & test scores, **not just admission requirements**
 - Compare how you fit into the college's profile
 - ▶ Pay close attention to how college's calculate GPA for evaluation of applications! Each one is different!

BUILDING A COLLEGE LIST

"Reach schools" are those where your academic credentials fall below the school's range for the freshman class.

"Target schools" are schools where your academic credentials fall within or perhaps slightly exceed the school's range for the freshman class.

"Safety schools" are schools you will almost definitely get into because your academic credentials are much better than the typical range for their freshman class.





Grade Point Average FAQs

- Cumulative GPA (on transcript) includes all courses taken in HS
- Academic GPA (different from cumulative GPA on AHS transcript)
 - Also know as core GPA, core academic GPA, etc.
 - Basis is English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and World Language courses
 - Academic GPA is usually viewed unweighted

HOPE GPA

Any courses taken in English, Math, Science, Social Studies and World Languages. More on this later.

SAT & ACT:

Some schools require this. Some are "Test Optional" with additional requirements. Some are "Test Optional" with no additional requirements. Check the college's website to see their policy on SAT/ACT.



SAT & ACT: Some schools test optional but REQUIRED by UGA and GA Tech for 2023-24

Please note: The High **School Grade Point** Average listed here is NOT the same as the Allatoona cumulative GPA found on transcripts! Check with individual colleges to see what they include in that number!

- The University System of Georgia (USG) will continue the temporary waiver of test score requirements for Academic Year 2023-2024 (Fall 2023, Spring 2024, Summer 2024) admission at 24 of the 26 USG institutions. The temporary waiver does not apply to the Georgia Institute of Technology and the University of Georgia.
- For Academic Year 2023-2024, the remaining institutions have two options to make admission decisions:
- Freshman index: Includes high school grade point average and test scores for either the SAT or ACT.
- Test Optional: Use the high school grade point average on the required high school curriculum without a standardized test score at the following minimum grade point averages:
 - 3.4 for research universities: Augusta University and Georgia State university
 - 3.2 for comprehensive universities and Georgia College and State University:
 Georgia Southern University, Kennesaw State University, University of West Georgia
 and Valdosta State University.
 - 3.0 for state universities: Albany State University, Clayton State University, Columbus State University, Fort Valley State University, Georgia Southwestern State University, Middle Georgia State University, Savannah State University and the University of North Georgia.
 - State colleges (Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College, Atlanta Metropolitan State College, College of Coastal Georgia, Dalton State College, East Georgia State College, Georgia Gwinnett College, Georgia Highlands College, Gordon State College and South Georgia State College) continue to be test optional in accordance with Board policy.
- Test scores continue to be required to apply for Zell Miller scholarships. The test optional path is not available for dual enrollment. Students applying for dual enrollment must still meet existing admissions requirements.

 - If there is a school report.
- If possible, review the entire application before you begin.



Common App

- The Common App is an undergraduate college admission application that applicants may use to apply to any of the 1000+ member colleges and universities.
- You can access the Common App by going to www.commonapp.org. Once you are there, click "Find a College" to see if your college uses the Common App.
- Some schools are Common App exclusive, which means they do not accept any application other than the Common App. Some schools accept both the Common App and their own individualized, web-based application.



Agreeing to Waive FERPA

What is the FERPA Waiver?

- Since FERPA is a complex law, we want to provide some key information before you respond to the FERPA waiver question.
- 1. How does FERPA relate to your college application?
 - FERPA gives you the right to review confidential letters of recommendation under certain circumstances IF:
 - You are enrolled in college and that college saves the recommendations for enrolled students, OR
 - You are 18 or older.
- 2. In the application you'll be asked if you want to waive this right. Why would you want to do that?
 - Waiving your right lets colleges know that you do not intend to read your recommendations, which helps reassure colleges that the letters are candid and truthful.
 - Some recommenders may refuse to write a letter for you unless you waive your rights. Check with your counselor or teachers to see if any of them follow such a policy.

DEADLINES

- Regular Deadline: receive a decision at the standard response date.
- Early Action: receive a decision earlier than the standard response date BUT are NOT required to accept the admission offer or pay deposit prior to May 1
- ▶ <u>Early Decision (BINDING)</u>: Commit to enroll at a college if admitted & offered a satisfactory financial aid packet. Application deadlines are usually November to December. You can only apply ED to one school.
- ▶ <u>Single Choice/Restricted Early Action</u>: You cannot apply early to other colleges but you can apply regular decision to other colleges
- Rolling: admission decisions are usually made within 6 weeks of submitting the application.
- Priority Deadlines: mostly associated with getting into institutional scholarship pools. Check those deadlines closely.

Step-by-Step Process

- 1. Select what colleges you're applying to
- 2. Determine application types: Common App, Direct to Institution
- Submit your college applications your "package" (may include essays and/or a resume)
- 4. Send your test scores via College Board/ACT
- 5. Request recommendations (if needed)
- 6. Use Naviance our "delivery" system. Students must:
 - Add colleges
 - Match your Common App (if using the Common App system)
 - Invite teacher recommenders (if recommendations are needed)
 - Complete Senior Survey and Parent Survey (if recommendations or school report are needed)
- 7. Request initial transcripts through the Counseling Office
- 8. Track your package

Requesting Transcripts -2 Step Process-

Step 1. Request your official high school transcript through Naviance.

- ▶ Log onto your Naviance student account
- Select the COLLEGES tab
- Under COLLEGES select "Colleges I'm Applying To"
- Click on "+", add each college/university, including application information
- Click "Add Application"

Step 2. You MUST sign & pay \$2 per transcript, in the Counseling Office

► For Common App documents, you MUST link your Common App

BOTH parts of the above process must be completed or transcripts will not be sent.

Teacher Recommendations

- ► Allow <u>at least 3-4 weeks</u> for teachers to complete their recommendation portion of your application!
- ▶ Ask the teacher(s) you would like to write recommendations BEFORE you submit request in Naviance.
- Students "invite" their teachers to upload and send letters of recommendation in two steps:
 - Provide teachers with a list of schools to which you are asking the teacher to write.
 - 2. Add the request digitally under your "Colleges I'm Applying To" tab.
 - 3. IMPORTANT: ASSIGN YOUR TEACHERS TO SPECIFIC SCHOOLS, NOT "All Applications"

- HOPE GPA is calculated using core courses only (English, Math, Science, Social Studies & World Lang)
- No quality points for honors
- ► +0.5 quality points for AP & Dual Enrollment up to 4.0
- If you do not earn HOPE out of high school, you will have the opportunity to be reevaluated at 30, 60 & 90 college hours

Steps to Financial Aid: FAFSA

- ► Free Application for Federal Student Aid https://studentaid.gov
- Complete beginning Oct 1-The earlier the better!!
- ▶ Use parents' tax information from the prior year (If your student will be in college during the 2023-24 schoolyear, use 2021 taxes.)
- ▶ If parents are divorced, you will only provide information for the parent your student lived with the most over the past 12 months. If your student lived with both parents equally, you will provide information for the parent that provided the most financial support over the past 12 months.

Steps to Institutional Aid: CSS Profile

- Many private colleges require the CSS Profile in addition to the FAFSA
- Used by many Early Action/Early Decision Institutions
- Apply for College Financial Aid CSS Profile | College Board
- CSS Profile is available October 1, 2022
 - \$25 Original Application Fee/One College
 - \$16 for additional college/program
 - Fee waivers awarded to families making less than \$100,000 based on information given when completing form.

The Academic Common Market

The Academic Common Market tuition-savings program for college students in 15 SREB states, who want to pursue degrees that are not offered by their in-state institutions. Students can enroll in out-of-state institutions that offer their degree program and pay the institution's in-state tuition rates.
