How Do I Build My College List?

Know <u>your</u> academic profile

- Core, unweighted GPA
- Standardized test scores
- Curriculum (rigor)

Search for the college's freshman profile

- Average or mid 50% GPA & test scores, not just admission requirements
- Compare how you fit into the college's profile
- Pay close attention to how college's calculate GPA for evaluation of applications! Each one is different!

BUILDING A COLLEGE LIST

"Reach schools" are those where your academic credentials fall below the school's range for the freshman class.

> **"Target schools"** are schools where your academic credentials fall within or perhaps slightly exceed the school's range for the freshman class.

"Safety schools" are schools you will almost definitely get into because your academic credentials are much better than the typical range for their freshman class.



Grade Point Average FAQs

- Cumulative GPA (on transcript) includes all courses taken in HS
- Academic GPA (different from cumulative GPA on AHS transcript)
 - Also know as core GPA, core academic GPA, etc.
 - Basis is English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and World Language courses
 - Academic GPA is usually viewed unweighted
 - "High School GPA" used by state schools is based on 17 core courses required for graduation in GA.
- HOPE GPA
 - Any courses taken in English, Math, Science, Social Studies and World Languages. More on this later.


University System of GA test optional info

The University System of Georgia (USG) will continue the temporary waiver of test score requirements for Academic Year 2024-2025 (Fall 2024, Spring 2025, and Summer 2025) admission at 23 of the 26 USG institutions. The temporary waiver does not apply to the Georgia Institute of Technology, the University of Georgia, or Georgia College and State University. For Academic Year 2024-2025, the remaining institutions have two options to make admission decisions:

1.Freshman index: Includes high school grade point average and test scores for either the SAT or ACT. NOTE – THE "HIGH SCHOOL GRADE POINT AVERAGE" ONLY INCLUDES THE 17 CORE COURSES THAT ARE REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION!

2. Test Optional: Use the high school grade point average on the required high school curriculum without a standardized test score at the following minimum grade point averages:

- 3.4 for research universities: Augusta University and Georgia State University.
- 3.2 for comprehensive universities: Kennesaw State University, Georgia Southern University, University of West Georgia and Valdosta State University.
- 3.0 for state universities: Albany State University, Clayton State University, Columbus State University, Fort Valley State University, Georgia Southwestern State University, Middle Georgia State University, Savannah State University and the University of North Georgia.
- State colleges (Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College, Atlanta Metropolitan State College, College of Coastal Georgia, Dalton State College, East Georgia State College, Georgia Gwinnett College, Georgia Highlands College, Gordon State College and South Georgia State College) continue to be test optional in accordance with Board policy.

Common App

- The Common App is an undergraduate college admission application that applicants may use to apply to any of the 1000+ member colleges and universities.
- You can access the Common App by going to www.commonapp.org. Once you are there, click "Find a College" to see if your college uses the Common App.
- Some schools are Common App exclusive, which means they do not accept any application other than the Common App. Some schools accept both the Common App and their own individualized, web-based application.



Agreeing to Waive FERPA

What is the FERPA Waiver?

- Since FERPA is a complex law, we want to provide some key information before you respond to the FERPA waiver question.
- 1. How does FERPA relate to your college application?
 - FERPA gives you the right to review confidential letters of recommendation under certain circumstances IF:
 - You are enrolled in college and that college saves the recommendations for enrolled students, OR
 - You are 18 or older.
- 2. In the application you'll be asked if you want to waive this right. Why would you want to do that?
 - Waiving your right lets colleges know that you do not intend to read your recommendations, which helps reassure colleges that the letters are candid and truthful.
 - Some recommenders may refuse to write a letter for you unless you waive your rights. Check with your counselor or teachers to see if any of them follow such a policy.

DEADLINES

- **<u>Regular Deadline</u>**: receive a decision at the standard response date.
- Early Action: receive a decision earlier than the standard response date BUT are NOT required to accept the admission offer or pay deposit prior to May 1
- Early Decision (BINDING): Commit to enroll at a college if admitted & offered a satisfactory financial aid packet. Application deadlines are usually November to December. You can only apply ED to one school.
- Single Choice/Restricted Early Action: You cannot apply early to other colleges but you can apply regular decision to other colleges
- Rolling: admission decisions are usually made within 6 weeks of submitting the application.
- Priority Deadlines: mostly associated with getting into institutional scholarship pools. Check those deadlines closely.

Step-by-Step Process

- **1**. Select what colleges you're applying to
- 2. Determine application types: Common App, Direct to Institution
- 3. Submit your college applications your "package" (may include essays and/or a resume)
- 4. Send your test scores via College Board/ACT
- 5. Request recommendations (if needed)
- 6. Use Naviance our "delivery" system. Students must:
 - Add colleges
 - Match your Common App (if using the Common App system)
 - Invite teacher recommenders (if recommendations are needed)
 - Complete Senior Survey and Parent Survey (if recommendations or school report are needed)
- 7. Request initial transcripts through the Counseling Office
- 8. Track your package

Requesting Transcripts -2 Step Process-

Step 1. Request your official high school transcript through Naviance.

- Log onto your Naviance student account
- Select the COLLEGES tab
- Under COLLEGES select "Colleges I'm Applying To"
- Click on "+", add each college/university, including application information
- Click "Add Application"


Step 2. You MUST sign & pay \$2 per transcript, in the Counseling Office


Teacher Recommendations

- Allow <u>at least 3-4 weeks</u> for teachers to complete their recommendation portion of your application!
- Ask the teacher(s) you would like to write recommendations BEFORE you submit request in Naviance.
- Students "invite" their teachers to upload and send letters of recommendation in Naviance.
 - Add the request digitally under your "Colleges I'm Applying To" tab.
 - IMPORTANT: ASSIGN YOUR TEACHERS TO SPECIFIC SCHOOLS, NOT "All Applications"



 - \$16 for additional college/program
 - Fee waivers awarded to families making less than \$100,000 based on information given when completing form.
