

Our Goals for Students Achievement

District Improvement Plan goals:

- Increase student performance in all core content areas by 2% annually as measured by achievement data.
- CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/programs by 10% as measured by CLTS Parent data, survey results & web view module.
- By 2023, we will reorganize the professional learning framework to meet the needs of all students to ensure alignment with the superintendent priorities as measured by professional learning opportunities, surveys, and student achievement.
- By the end of the 2025 school year, every school will have identified practices and resources that support student success as measured by student achievement, perception, and discipline data.

Fair Oaks Elementary goals for Student Achievement:

Goal #1: ELA The percentage of students scoring proficient and advanced on the Reading Inventory will increase by 15% from August 2022 to May 2023 in Grades 2 through 5.

Kindergarten- 40% of kindergarten students will score a Level D or greater (On Level) on the Jan Richardson Reading Assessment by May 2023.

Goal #2: Math The percentage of students scoring proficient or advanced on the Math Inventory K-5 will increase by 15% from Aug. 2022 to May 2023.

Kindergarten: Students will be proficient in addition and subtraction within 5.

Goal #3: Excessive absences (15 or more days) will be decreased by 50% from the 2022 school year to the 2023 school year.

Teachers, Parents, and Students – Together for Success

Teachers. The Kindergarten Fair Oaks Elementary School teachers will work with students and their families to develop students' love of learning. The focus of our key connections with families will be:

- ✓ Teachers will send home books quarterly using words and spelling patterns we have learned.
- ✓ Teachers will add alphabet charts, shapes, numbers, colors, and sight word lists to CTLS for student practice.
- ✓ Teachers will send home a 100s chart and sight word for students to practice every night.

At Home. Fair Oaks Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' academic understanding. Families may have other ideas to add to the list:

- ✓ Parents will listen to their child read to them for 10-20 minutes a night.
- ✓ Parents will help child go on CTLS to practice the alphabet, shapes, numbers, colors, and sight words every night.
- ✓ Parents will help their child count to 100 using the hundreds chart and practice sight word cards every night.

Students. Fair Oaks Elementary School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school:

- ✓ Student will read to an adult for 10-20 minutes a night.
- ✓ Student will go on to their CTLS class and practice naming letters, colors, shapes, and sight words.
- ✓ Students will practice counting to 100 and reading and spelling sight words.
