## CTAE will prepare students to become college and career ready to compete in a global workforce through exploration, experience, and extension.



Campbell's CTAE Program will empower students to successfully participate and compete in a dynamic global workplace. To this end, the curriculum focuses on:

- · infusion of rigorous and relevant academic instruction
- application of essential global emerging technologies
- early identification of career cluster opportunities
- · career employability and economic/living skills
- · preparation for post-secondary studies and lifelong learning

#### What is CTAE

Campbell High School offers several CTAE Career Pathways that consist of three sequenced courses, an end of pathway assessment (EOPA), and credentials that align with national and state- wide skills certifications.

#### Benefits of a CHS CTAE Pathway Completer

Complete all 3 Level courses in a pathway, pass the EOPA, and a student will receive a Pathway Completion Certificate, Graduation Cord, and the student's name will be placed on a Campbell HS CTAE banner of pathway completers displayed in the school. Each Pathway may offer additional credentials.

### What is a CTAE Pathway?

A pathway is a sequence of three (3) courses in the same career cluster.

### What is a CTAE Pathway Concentrator?

To be a pathway concentrator, a student needs to successfully complete two (2) CTAE courses in a pathway.

### What is a CTAE Pathway Completer?

To be a pathway completer, a student needs to successfully complete all three (3) CTAE courses in the pathway. CTAE pathway completers that pass the End of Pathway Assessments earn industry credentials of value.

the product. Both students and businesses worked on developing professional aptitudes during the project-based learning activity.

During CBA networking events, students are offered continued opportunities through work-based learning, internships, apprenticeships, and jobs. Students can provide a need for a business that lacks employees with the relevant technological skills needed to stay relevant in today's business climate. For example, by hiring a generation of workers fluent in social media and website development, local businesses will have the capacity to improve their online presence and grow their potential profit.

So far, the students participating in the program are hitting the mark. "When I was president of the Smyrna Business Association

in 2018, we approached Josh Ford and [CHS to work with Mr. Ford and Mr. Chasteen teacher] Michael Chasteen about helping us find high school interns for our association. We wanted four, and they sent 11," says David Monroe, owner/broker, JWC Real Estate, and principal/owner, Berryfield Hotel Group. "These interns were so sharp, our members embraced them and even used them in their own businesses. The interns get real-world business stories of success as well as failure, and they also get to understand the social

side of business, not just numbers." The students are enjoying the program as well. Eleventh-grader Lyric Love is a Work Based Learning student and CBA intern. "Being a part of the Campbell Business Association has been an incredibly enriching experience," she says. "Having the ability

# What is an Industry Credential of Value?

A credential of value is an assessment / credentialing opportunity that would not only support the mandates set forth in the Perkins IV Legislation but would also support Georgia students in their quest to leave high school with valuable credentials. The credentials of value offered in GA are comprised of:

- Industry certifications/credentials
- Occupational assessments
- State licensures and state-developed assessments

# What is Work- Base d Learning?

Work-Based Learning is a class where students earn credit through a variety of work experiences which allow them to apply the skills they have learned within their pathway of choice.

# What is Youth Apprenticeship?

Youth Apprenticeship is a more in-depth application of career skills where students spend a total of 360 hours in the workspace. Students earn credit for these structured combination of school based and work-based learning.

# What is a Career & Technical Student Organization?
