EOC INFORMATION

All students enrolled in Algebra I, Biology, American Literature, and U.S. History will be taking the Georgia Milestones End-of-Course Assessment on the following dates:

American Literature	November 28-30 th
US History	December 4 th
Biology	December 5 th
Algebra 1	December 6-7 th

The Georgia Milestones Assessment System is a comprehensive summative assessment program and represents a single system of summative assessments that span all three levels of the state's educational system – elementary, middle, and high school. The system is designed to send consistent signals about students' preparedness for the next level, be it the next grade, course, or endeavor, such as entering college or beginning a career after leaving the K-12 educational system.

During the assessment period for each course, students must bring their charged laptop and a charger to school. They will be using their CCSD issued device for testing. Teachers will provide opportunities for practice before the assessment. We encourage students to <u>click here</u> to utilize the testing tools and access practice tests to get familiar with the platform. This website is a valuable resource and students can access it from home for additional practice.

SPRING SCHEDULING UPDATE

Scheduling received over 900 drop/add submissions. Please be patient as we review these requests. It will take several weeks for us to get through them all. You will receive an email once your submission has been approved or denied with an explanation. Often, when there is a delay in processing your request, it is because we are waiting to see if a seat opens in the class you are requesting. Again, please be patient with the process. If you have requested an online or dual enrollment class, make sure you see your counselor to get approval and necessary paperwork. These requests are not processed until we get counselor approval.

GEORGIA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION PARENT SURVEY

Harrison is offering an extended learning program to assist students in writing and math.

Our extended tutoring program runs through Thursday, December 14th, 2023.

Others may only need additional assistance in one of the offered subjects and would come for one session of tutoring a week.

Math: Room 410 on Tuesdays/Wednesdays/Thursdays from 3:45 to 4:45. Students from the Math Honor Society will be available to support math students in Foundation of Algebra through Advanced Algebra. Higher level math tutoring may be available by specific teachers. Please ask your child's math teacher about opportunities.

Writing: Room 9129 on Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday from 7:15 to 7:45am and from 3:45 to 4:30pm. Students from the National English Honor Society will be available to support students.
