We completed day one of the American Literature EOC today. We want to remind everyone that all students enrolled in Algebra I, Biology, American Literature, and U.S. History will be taking the Georgia Milestones End-of-Course Assessment on the following dates:

- 1. ONLY SENIORS AND JUNIORS ARE ELIGIBLE TO PARK ON CAMPUS. WE DO NOT ALLOW SOPHOMORES TO PARK ON CAMPUS DUE TO PARKING SPACE LIMITATIONS.
- 2. The application must be completed and submitted with all the necessary documents uploaded.
- 3. Payments must be made to MyPaymentsPlus prior to picking up the decal

- 4. Dates for pickup will be posted to the school website. Pickup dates will be in early January.
- **5.** Parking on campus without a decal will result in fines and potential disciplinary action.



#### **ORCHESTRA**


Congratulations to Orchestra on a wonderful Winter Concert. Their performance before the Thanksgiving Break was amazing. Shout out to these talented Hoyas!
