| Math | 4 Credits <br> - Including Algebra, Geometry, Advanced Algebra, $4^{\text {th }}$ Math |
| Science | 4 Credits <br> - Including Biology; Chemistry, Environmental or Earth; Physics or Physical Science; and 4 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ Science |
| Social Studies | 3 Credits <br> - Including World History, US History, and Government/Economics |

$\square$ HOPE can be earned in college, if not earned with high school GPA

## HOPE Rigor

$\square 4$ courses of rigor required
$\square$ Advanced Math: Alg. II or higher \& Advanced Science
$\square$ AP, IB and Dual Enrollment in core subjects
$\square$ Advanced World Language (second year and higher)

## -When to INCREASE Rigor:

- Improve study skills
- Improve critical thinking
$>$ Earn college credit
- Boost GPA
