Transfer of Rights

In Georgia, when a person turns 18, they are considered a legal adult. Adults have the right to: vote, marry, obtain a credit card, consent to medical treatments, make living arrangements, sign contracts, and more.

If a person will need support in their life decisions or financial management, there are several options available for families.













Options for Support:

Guardianship: In order to be appointed an adult's guardian, you must petition the court. The Probate Court may then appoint a guardian to make decisions regarding the person's health or safety.

Conservatorship: In order to be appointed an adult's conservator, you must petition the court. The Probate Court may then appoint a conservator to make financial decisions for the person.

Power of Attorney: The person signs a legal document that designates others to make some or all of their decisions, on their behalf, in certain circumstances.


Supported Decision Making: The person makes their own decisions, but they have a network of people they have chosen to help them make those decisions.
