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Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals:

- Increase student performance in all core content areas by 2% annually as measured by achievement data.
- CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/programs by 10% as measured by CTLS Parent data, survey results & web view module.
- By 2023, we will reorganize the PL framework to meet the needs of all schools to ensure alignment with Superintendent Priorities as measured by PL opportunities, surveys, and student achievement.
- By the end of 2025 school year every school will have identified practices and resources that support student success as measured by student academic, perception or discipline data.

School Goals:

- The percentage of Grade 3-5 students scoring At or Above Proficiency on the Reading Inventory (RI) will increase from 38% to 48% by May 2022.
- The percentage of Grade 3-5 students scoring At or Above Proficiency on the Math Inventory (MI) will increase from 42% to 50% by May 2022.

In the Intermediate Classrooms
Our teachers in grades 3-5 will work with students and their families to improve student success in Reading, Math and behavior (PBIS). The focus of our key connections with families will be:

- Providing families with at home access to Istation Reading and Dreambox Math.
- Offer free Family Engagement Nights with real world, hands on activities that support student learning and new virtual workshops.
- Providing families with suggestions on how to choose just right books for their child to help meet their independent reading goals.
- Provide families resources to support learning and build a solid foundation in reading and math.

At Home

Sanders Elementary parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in Reading, Math. Families responsibilities may include:

- Accessing Istation Reading and CLEVER at home to provide their child support on their individualized learning path & build proficiency in reading and math.
- Plan to attend Family Engagement Nights to support my child with real-world hands-on activities that support their learning.
- Read monthly newsletter to find resources and strategies to help my child at home.
- Read with my child every night to support their independent reading goals.
- Practice acquiring new vocabulary to support reading development and that use of math manipulatives to strengthen math understandings.

- Utilize Istation Reading & CLEVER at home to practice skills on my individualized learning path and meet my usage requirements.

- Read books at home every night that are just right for me and practice my reading strategies.
- Utilize Dreambox to build fact fluency in math.
