ABSENCES

At Kincaid Elementary, we believe that a large part of your child(ren) being successful is attending school regularly and in a timely fashion. <u>Cobb County Policy requires us</u> to take the following actions:

- 3 unexcused days- phone call from teacher
- 5 unexcused days- letter from school
- 7 unexcused days- referral to school social worker
- 10+ unexcused days- truancy intervention panel

The day your child returns to school after an absence, he/she must have a written excuse signed by a parent or guardian. Excused absences are those for personal illness, death in the family and recognized religious holidays. The procedure is established by Georgia State law.

Please be aware that any student who checks in after 11:10 a.m. or checks out before 11:10 a.m. is considered absent for that day.

Helpful suggestions:

- Take vacations during schools breaks in September, November, December, <u>February</u> and April.
- Schedule doctor appointments after 11:10 a.m. so that the student is not

ACCIDENTS AND ILLNESSES

If a child becomes ill during the day, parents will be notified. If head lice are detected, you will be called to pick up your child. Your child will be re-admitted to school upon proof of treatment. If an accident should occur requiring medical attention, 911 will be called if parents cannot be contacted. Judgment in such cases is at the discretion of the school authorities and parents assume financial responsibility. Please make sure phone numbers are updated and on file in the office and the clinic. <u>It is essential that</u> we know how to reach you at all times.

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM (ASP)

ASP is childcare provided for any Kincaid student from the time school ends until 6:00 p.m. It operates under the guidelines as established by the Cobb County Board of Education and is available every day that school is in session, including Conference Week and Early Release days. It is <u>not</u> available on student holidays. If school closes early because of inclement weather, there will be no ASP. <u>Please monitor radio/TV weather</u> <u>reports</u> for <u>updates and have other contingency plans available</u>.

All students enrolled at Kincaid are expected to register for ASP. This will allow a student to use the program in the event an emergency arises, and the child cannot go home unsupervised.

ASP is a prepaid program. Fees are \$35.00 per week or \$7.00 per day for each child. There is also a \$10.00 registration fee for each child, payable the first day the child stays in the program. Payment is due on Monday morning for the week the student stays, or on the day the student stays as a drop-in. Payment envelopes are provided for your use and should include the child's name to ensure correct posting of payment to the child's account. If payment was not received prior to 2:30 p.m., then payment must be made at the time the child is signed out. Failure to do so may result in denial of services.

Birthdays

Birthday treats sent in by individual families are not permitted. Birthday treats and drinks can be pre-ordered <u>through the</u> <u>café only</u> by using <u>this order link</u>.

Please allow a 1-week notice when requesting birthday treats

Do not send in treats, balloons, or party invitations for select students.

How to Prepare My Child...

Kindergarten... here I come!

Language Arts

- Read with your child everyday.
- Help your child learn to identify all the letters of the alphabet.



 Teach your child how to write their first name beginning with a capital letter followed by lowercase letters.

Math

- Help your child learn to identify the following shapes: circle, square, rectangle, and triangle.
- Practice writing numbers 0-5
- Count up to 10 objects



Other Helpful Skills



- Teach your child their address.
- How to tie their shoes.
- How to button pants and shirts and zip up their jacket.
- Encourage your child to become comfortable attending to his/her bathroom needs.

Why is it Important to Read to your Child?



 At the end of Kindergarten, a child has been in school a total of **1200 hours...**

The same child at the same age has been outside school for 52,000 hours."

In a YEAR kids learn 4,000-12,000 new words by reading books.

Kids who read 1 million words each year score in the top 2% on standardized tests.



WILL MY CHILD SEE THE SCHOOL COUNSELOR?

ALL students will have classroom lessons twice a month on social emotional learning skills (SEL), academic skills, and career awareness in their classroom

SOME students will have small group lessons weekly on friendship skills, coping skills for managing big feelings, or changes in the family-with parent permission

A FEW students will have individual counseling sessions, for a few weeks, after parent consultation

MANY parents will have conferences, meetings, calls, emails and referrals to outside agencies

TIPS TO PREPARE YOUR CHILD

Decrease or phase out naps. For preschoolers who still take a nap, begin decreasing nap time so that he/she will be ready for a full day by the time kindergarten starts.

Practice talking to adults. Kindergartners will be meeting a lot of new adults at our school. Teachers, media specialist, nurse, bus drivers, counselors and other support staff will all be interacting with your student. Please let them know it's okay to talk to the grownups at school. Have your child practice saying their name "loud and proud". You can also help your student get comfortable talking to adults by ordering for themselves at restaurants, the public library or the doctor.

Play "school" at home over the summer by sit on the rug in front of you for a story, write their name, answer questions by raising hand. Play "lunchroom" in your kitchen by answering questions about different food choices and carrying plate to the table.

Establish bedtime routines. Resume the regular bedtime routines about a week before school starts to help ease the kindergarten transition. If you let your child stay up a little later during the summer, for example, gradually get back to the bedtime you will expect when kindergarten starts. Talk to your child about why you are doing this and how it will help his/her back-to-school transition.

TIPS TO PREPARE YOUR CHILD

Plan time for breakfast. Having a good breakfast before leaving for school is important. Be sure to adjust your morning schedule to account for the extra time for your child to enjoy breakfast or make a plan for your child to eat at school.

Establish a morning routine. Do a "dry run" of the new morning routine, whether it is walking to the bus stop with your child, driving to the new school, walking together to school, etc. to see how much time it will take. Cobb typically does a bus ride along before school starts.

Expect exhaustion. Kindergarten is a busy place. Your child may come home tired or be irritable at bedtime or in the morning. Move bedtime up and be consistent in your morning routine.

TIPS FOR PARENTS

- Are YOU ready for Kindergarten?? Your child will be <u>watching</u> you!!! If you ask them 14 times if they are worried about starting Kindergarten... they are going to start thinking they should be!!!
- They are <u>listening</u> when you speak to friends and on the phone. Show that you are excited and confident in knowing your child is ready by speaking positively about your child starting school.

School Anxiety and School Refusal

- The tips and books we've mentioned should help with getting your child ready for school.
- Some children will have occasional bouts of school refusal, or a rocky first few weeks. The best thing to do is remain calm and positive and continue your routine. Allowing a child to stay home after a tantrum teaches them to throw a tantrum to get a day off.
- Send your child to school, even in tears. Chances are, they will be just fine by the time they get off the bus. You can always email the teacher or counselor letting us know they had a rough morning. Let us know if you want a return call or email to know how they are doing.
