District Goals for Student Achievement

- Increase student performance in all core content areas by 2% annually as measured by achievement data.
- CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/programs by 10% as measured by CLTS Parent data, survey results & web view module.
- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase rate from 87% to 88% as measured by Ga.DOE adjust cohort graduation rate.

Goal #1: Literacy: The percentage of K-2nd grade students scoring on or above grade level will increase from 23% to 33% as measured by the Spring 2025 Amira assessment.
