

Magnet Testing for Non-Cobb County Students

Thank you for your interest in applying to one or more of the Cobb County Magnet Programs. **Non-CCSD students (private school, homeschool, out of district) who have not taken the PSAT 8/9 must register to take this test as part of the magnet admissions process.** If you took the PSAT 8/9 at your school, please contact the magnet coordinators to find out how to properly submit your scores.

The PSAT 8/9 will be administered at the following locations on the following dates:

| 1) October 15, 9 am (Saturday) | South Cobb High School | (50 available seats) |
| 2) October 15, 9 am (Saturday) | North Cobb High School | (200 available seats) |
| 3) October 22, 9 am (Saturday) | Kennesaw Mountain High School | (50 available seats) |
| 4) October 22, 9 am (Saturday) | Wheeler High School | (80 available seats) |
- 5) October 22, 9 am (Saturday) - Campbell High School – only for students that can document the need for testing accommodations.

This testing session at Campbell High School requires prior approval and is not part of the registration document. If a student has been granted accommodations for testing, please have your school counselor contact Andrew Kutscher at andrew.kutscher@cobbk12.org. Documentation of accommodations will be required prior to testing.

The cost of the exam is \$15. Information about how to pay for the exam will be emailed after registration is complete.

It is the student's responsibility to register to take the test. **Seating is limited for each testing session and the seats will be filled on a first come, first served basis.** This test is the official PSAT 8/9 from College Board and it is an important component of a complete Magnet application. Results will be reported directly to the student and sent to the Magnet Programs. If you have questions about the test, please contact one of the magnet coordinators or Andrew Kutscher from the Advanced Learning Office.

On the day of the test, bring two sharpened pencils with erasers, a watch, a **photo ID** (A valid school- or government-issued photo ID or a notarized [College Board Student ID Form](#)), and an approved calculator. Students will not be permitted to carry a cell phone into the testing room. Students must arrive at their testing locations between 8:15am and 8:30am to get their seat assignments and fill out information on their answer sheets prior to beginning the exam. Testing will begin promptly at 9am and testing will conclude by 1pm. No late arrivals will be permitted to test. If the Cobb County School District is closed for inclement weather, please check the magnet schools' websites for further information.
