Cognia STEM Focus Highlights & Strategies

- These are the standards (handout given at meeting). We are working towards these things and integrating stem into our frameworks. We think it is essential for students to see the Vikings design process that students implement frequently. New District Bullying prevention program

- There are 5 lessons we will be providing our students shortly. We will have a universal hand sign used to signal allow others to know we need them to STOP interacting with us. They will get two face to face lessons with the counselors and then the last three our counselors will video tape and include talking points for teachers to talk with the students. These lessons will include cyber bullying, gossip, and inappropriate remarks.
