District Goals for Student Achievement

- Increase student performance in all core content areas by 2% annually as measured by achievement data.
- CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/programs by 10% as measured by CLTS Parent data, survey results & web view module.
- By 2024, we will implement the professional learning framework to meet the needs of schools to ensure alignment with the superintendent priorities as measured by professional learning opportunities, surveys, and student achievement.
- By the end of the 2025 school year, every school will have identified practices and resources that support student success as measured by student academic, perception and discipline data.

Norton Park Goal(s) for Student Achievement

- 60% of students in each grade, 1-5, will score proficient or above on the summative math assessment, based on the 10-day math assessment cycle by May 2024..
- 85% of students in each grade level K-2 will achieve an Early Literacy Framework Assessment score of at least 90% by May 2024

The percentage of students in each grade level, third through fifth, reading on or above grade level will increase by 10% according to the Next Steps Guided Reading Assessment from August 2023 to May 2024.

• Reduce the number of office referrals from 274 (May 2023) to 233 (15%)by the end of May 2024.

- Instruct students in real life situations how to be safe, on-task, accountable, and respectful. (SOAR)

- Practice multiplication and division facts (0-9) at home with your child.
- Ask your child questions about their independent reading book.
- Discuss with your child how they can be safe, on-task, accountable, and respectful in real-life situations.

- Practice multiplication and division facts (0-9) daily.
