What is a Title I School?


Title I is a federally funded program which provides services to schools based on student economic needs.

- ▶ Cobb County has 47 schools with 50% or more students participating in the school lunch program.
- ▶ **Osborne High School is 79.68% Free and Reduced Lunch**

The purpose of Title I under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA) is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments.



Osborne High School is a Schoolwide Title I School. All students benefit from Title I resources in a Schoolwide Title I School.






How our School Spends Title I Money ?

Funds are used to obtain a high-quality education for all of our students by highly qualified faculty and staff.

Promotion Criteria

- Students earn units of credit by successfully completing courses.
- In order to graduate, a student must earn a minimum of 23 credits.
 - 5 to be promoted to a Sophomore
 - 10 to be promoted to a Junior
 - 16 to be promoted to a Senior

Students must earn credit in English, Science and Math each year to be promoted



What is Required by Law for Parent Involvement?

- Notification of Highly Qualified Teacher and Paraprofessional Status (Parent's right to know)
- Notification of School Status under ESEA
- 1% of System Allocation must be reserved for Parent Involvement
- Last year OHS Parental Involvement budget was \$4,600.00.

- In the case of a supply teacher, they are certified/degreed in the subject area which they are temporarily teaching.
