Family fun nights will be coming. Detailed information will be given via flyer, CTLS Parent, website, and marquee.



OUR GOALS FOR STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

DISTRICT GOALS

- Increase student performance in all core content areas by 2% annually as measured by achievement data. CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/programs by 10% as measured by CTLS Parent data, survey results & web view module.
- By 2023, we will reorganize the PL framework to meet the needs of all schools to ensure alignment with Superintendent Priorities as measured by PL opportunities, surveys, and student achievement.

SCHOOL GOAL(S) AND FOCUS AREAS

MATH Goal

Increase the percentage of students proficient in Math from 41% to 60% on the Math Inventory by the end of the 2021-2022 school year.

The focus area for Math is Addition and Subtraction Fact Fluency.

ELA Goal

Increase the percentage of students proficient in reading from 8% to 30% in English Language Arts on the WriteScore software program by the end of the 2021-2022 school year.

The focus are for Writing is using the Four-Square Graphic Organizer to generate ideas and details.
