- NJHS Food Drive It's Superbowl season, and what better way to celebrate it, than with our own <u>Soup-er-bowl Food Drive</u>! Starting Monday, February 14 through Friday February 18, McClure NJHS will be conducting a non-perishable food drive for MUST ministries. The food bank is in need of the following items: condensed soup, canned vegetables, chunky soup, mac & cheese, oatmeal, canned pasta, peanut butter. If you are able to participate, please have your child bring the items in to their homeroom teacher. We kindly ask that you do NOT send glass items.
- H.S. Registration High school counselors will be at McClure to answer questions about registration and help students sign up for classes. - DARE Day Coming up this Friday is our February DARE Day. DARE Day is the celebration of students with positive behavior. All students must earn enough PBIS Rewards points to attend. During DARE day we go outside, students can hang out and play with their friends, and we sell concessions like candy and soda (it's what they kids want!). - 7th Grade Vaccines Heads Up! All rising 7th grade students are required to have one dose of the Tdap and meningococcal vaccines to attend school. Once your child has received the required vaccines, please send a copy of the completed Georgia Department of Public Health Certificate of Immunization Form 3231 to McClure. It can be emailed to summer.lundberg@cobbk12.org or dropped off to the front office. Per Georgia law, in order for your child to remain in school, a completed immunization record must be on file for your child by the first day of the new school year. 6th grade parents, it's never too early to start planning ahead!
