- Goal #2 (Operational) Reduce the number of Office Disciplinary Referrals (ODRs) by 25%.

Our leadership teams developed these goals based on data from last year. Take a moment to look at each goal as it is described later in this newsletter. When we begin quarter 2, we will be sharing these goals with our students so that they can be on board as well. We know that our chances to not only meet, but exceed these goals are better when our staff, students, and parents are all aware of what the target is. Instructional

SSP Goal #1 – As stated above, our instructional goal for the year is to improve writing skills and writing proficiency for all students across all content areas. When we looked at last year's Milestones data, we noticed that our students read very well, especially when it comes to literary texts. However, their reading scores are not as strong on informational texts, and their writing on informational topics is their weakest area as a student body. We realize that students need skills to effectively read complex texts, extract evidence from the text, and write about what they read. It is for these reasons that we have adopted this year's SSP Goal #1 and our <u>Schoolwide Reading & Writing Strategies</u>.

In all content areas, we will be teaching your student(s) how to think about and annotate text as they read it. If they are better at reading and understanding text, they will be better able to write about it. Then we will be adopting the schoolwide strategy of C.E.R. (Claim, Evidence, Response) when responding to a writing prompt. This way, a student will read/mark text and write responses in the exact same way whether they are in ELA, Science, Social Studies, or STEM. Practicing these skills in all contents throughout this year will build their stamina and perseverance for reading and writing. We are excited to have this schoolwide system in place and cannot wait to keep you posted on our progress! Mission:

- **SSP Goal #2** As stated above, our second SSP goal is to reduce the number of Office Disciplinary Referrals (ODRs) by 25%. Our goal at McClure is to keep students in class learning with their peers. If a student is serving in-school or out-of-school suspension, they are not going to experience learning at the level we want. We began the year with our Cowboy Boot Camp, teaching every student about our procedures, protocols, and most importantly, our DARE expectations. We continue to recognize students who meet our DARE expectations daily, with our online DARE Store, and with Monthly DARE Days. We are currently on pace to meet this goal easily, but we are continuing to add to our motivators for positive student behavior.
